## About Darrell

*At 24, Darrell was covering an Atlanta Braves game on a sweltering day. "In seven innings, I drank about ten cups of fresh lemonade. I felt absolutely horrible, like I was dying and couldn't figure out why."*

*The next day, he went to his doctor. Darrell had put on post-college weight "my out-of-college 20 kind of turned into out-of-college 50." His doctor took one look at him and without checking his blood sugar, told him he had diabetes.*

*"I literally knew nothing of diabetes. So I remember saying, 'What do you mean I've got diabetes? Do I drink a lot of orange juice now?'"*

*Unfortunately he was misdiagnosed as type 2, and for the next 18 months, Darrell struggled with his sugar levels, rapid weight loss, and tried different treatments. He finally ended up in the hospital where an endocrinologist figured out he was type 1. Then, at least he was able*



*to move forward and ultimately become a T1D advocate.*

**On Eversense:** Darrell was one of the first to try Eversense. "I wanted in. I was inserted the first day they did implants."

The CGM dovetails directly into Darrell's advocacy work. "I want to show people that they can manage this disease in the way they want to because you can personalize this product like no other I've worn. Using the app, you can set your own parameters, and you can control it as tightly or as loosely as you want. You can set all of your predictive alerts however you want, and I believe that that sort of flexibility gives people that ability to do it how they want to do it."
